Immigrants make up 70.4% of the labour force in Calgary;¹ CIWA transitioned more than 700 clients to employment in the past year. #economiccontribution

Over 144K private incorporated businesses in Calgary are owned by immigrants;² CIWA's Easy Reading Business Development Tool helps immigrant women become entrepreneurs in 4 industries: beauty and body, childcare, cleaning and food. #socialinnovation

Immigrants account for 1 out of every 4 health-care sector workers;³ more than 500 clients served this past year come from this professional background. #strengthindiversity

Over 400K foreign born residents call Calgary home;⁴ last year, CIWA served more than 17K clients through individual & group services at the main office as well as at 81 locations across the city of Calgary. #welcomenewcomers

One-third of all immigrants in Canada volunteer and twothirds are members of social organizations;⁵ of the total number of 971 volunteers at CIWA, 95% are immigrants that bring years of skills and experience from their home countries. #communitydevelopment

Equally Safe is a #socialimpact partnership between CIWA, Calgary Police Service, Awo Taan Healing Lodge, Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter, Kerby Centre and YW Calgary aimed to address the current epidemic of domestic violence in Calgary.

CivicAction from Toronto and CIWA, #influencers and #changeleaders in their own right, partnered to host an event that brought together service providers and employers from Calgary to promote the benefits of youth employment through two national initiatives: YouthConnect and HireNext.

The idea of #innovation resonated strongly with health professionals from Mosaic Refugee Health Clinic and literacy practitioners as well as learners from CIWA who developed a series of tools to increase health access and improve health outcomes for all newcomers in Calgary.

Economic Security Alliance for Vulnerable Immigrant Women project connects employers and service providers as #changeleaders committed to enhancing workplace policies that support employment security of women fleeing domestic violence.

#Bethechange is the mission of those past CIWA Youth Program participants who are leading a gender equality initiative for immigrant girls in Calgary in collaboration with the Plan International Canada's Speakers Bureau Hub.

#Generosity of CIWA staff, clients and volunteers shone in the more than \$30K fundraised in support of the Cure Foundation and United Way of Calgary and Area.

Line Cook Training program clients contributed 110 volunteering hours to Brown Bagging for Calgary's Kids to ensure that no kids go hungry and to demonstrate that #communitymatters.

CIWA certified interpretation and translation volunteers services delivered more than \$185K of in-kind value to #payitforward and support agencies and businesses in Calgary.

#Buildingcapacity is at the core of CIWA bridging programs whose 355 clients provided 54K hours of volunteer support though job placements for a total in-kind value of \$1.35M.

Senior volunteers from the Arts & Craft Group produced hundreds of masks to support and show their #gratitude to COVID-19 frontline workers.



Over 70 CIWA volunteers contributed \$18K of in-kind value through 724 volunteer hours to support Cerebral Palsy Association, Elbow River Casino, ETHNIK Festival of Arts and Culture, Families Matter, NAR 10 Women's Conference, Shaw Charity Classic and Spectrum Events, proving that #volunteersrock.

A total of 48 volunteers, including senior women, raised over \$3K while doing #socialgood through arts & craft projects.

Our 24 former youth clients returned to support their peers through #civicengagement and #communityservice during field trips, as well as planning and brainstorming sessions to help improve youth experience.

A unique #philanthropy initiative by Certus Developments allowed CIWA to raise more than \$60K at the Planet Organic closeout sale to support SMILES free childcare program.

More than 40 lawyers and accountants performed 565 hours of #socialgood amounting to \$56K worth of legal and accounting services to #support low-income immigrant women and their families.

#Donors demonstrated that #givingisgood during the Adopt-a-Family initiative at Christmas, which saw over \$37K of in-kind donations providing relief to 44 low-income families.

#Charity is at the core of Burns Memorial Fund whose \$20K of financial support allowed immigrant families to access health, education and recreational services at no cost.

A total of 554 newcomer children received toys and teddy bears during the holiday season from Christmas Toy Drive #donors and Scott Land and Lease.

A total of 60 youth mentors became #influencers and made #impact by promoting multiculturalism and hosting Youth Forum 2020: "Confident Daughters Dynamic Leaders."

Four #impactmakers shared their lived experiences to #inspire other newcomers by participating on advisory committees hosted by Aspire Calgary and CIWA's Economic Security Alliance for Vulnerable Immigrant Women project.

A staggering number of 295 men and boys engaged through CIWA programs and services proving that they too can become #impactmakers, driven by the #purpose to support the settlement of immigrant women and their families.
